## Rules for Success

We want you to succeed at Hastings and beyond Hastings.

To be successful there are many skills which you must develop such as:

- The ability to work hard and show pride in your work
- The ability to cooperate and work with others
- Be on time and well prepared
- Effective written and verbal communication
- The ability to make a good impression with the way you dress and conduct yourself
- Show respect to and earn the respect of others
- The ability to develop yourself to be the best you can be
- Resilience and independence

These principles lead to these lesson rules:

1. Always work hard and try your best
2. Be on time and properly prepared
3. Work quietly
4. Listen and talk to others politely
5. Enjoy your learning

And these rules for behaviour in the corridor:

1. Walk and line up in a single file
2. Walk quietly and calmly
3. Stay on the right
4. Follow the one way system

**Mobile phones must not be used on the school site and music players must not be brought to school at all.**

## **HASTINGS HIGH SCHOOL TRIPS AND VISITS BEHAVIOUR CODE**

Any pupil taking part in an activity organised by the school must abide by the schools behaviour code. If your child is taking part in a **residential** activity run by the school you will also be invited to attend a meeting for parents and pupils where the expectations for behaviour are explained and reiterated.

As a school we reserve the right to withdraw your child from any activity if his or her behaviour in school, prior to the trip, results in teachers not having confidence that he or she will behave appropriately while away from school.

We feel it is important that you are aware of the following condition: **Any deposits paid will not be refunded, as normally companies will not return these under any circumstances.**

Should your child deliberately disregard the behaviour code outlined in advance of the trip or whilst on the visit, some or all of the following actions will be taken:

- Your child will be withdrawn from some or all of the activities organised during the visit.
- Your child will be excluded from school on return, in accordance with the school's usual disciplinary policy.
- Your child may not be invited to participate in other activities organised by school.
- In case of particularly serious circumstances you will be asked to arrange for your child to be returned home immediately at your expense.

## **HASTINGS HIGH SCHOOL SPORT CODE OF CONDUCT**

We encourage parents/spectators within the school to always be positive and encouraging towards all of the children, not just their own.

Parents/spectators have a great influence on children's enjoyment and success in sport. All children play sport because they first and foremost love their chosen sport – it's fun.

It is important to remember that however good a child becomes at any sport within our school, parents/spectators who show positive encouragement will contribute to:

- Children enjoying sport
- A sense of personal achievement
- Self-esteem
- Assist to improve the child's skills and techniques

A parent's/spectator's expectations and attitudes have a significant bearing on a child's attitude towards:

- Other players
- Officials
- Managers
- Spectators

We encourage parents/spectators to:

- Applaud the opposition as well as your own team
- Avoid coaching your child during the game
- Not to shout and scream
- Not to use or tolerate inappropriate language; foul or offensive language/comments, booing, abusive chants and gesticulation towards players, officials of opposing supporters are not appropriate at a school match
- Respect the referee's decision
- Give attention to each of the children involved in their chosen sport – not just the most talented.

## HASTINGS HIGH SCHOOL SPORT TRAVEL CODE OF CONDUCT

Your child will be informed on the team sheet or verbally where the match is and what time we will return.

He/she may take a mobile 'phone to the fixture, but staff will not take responsibility for these.

If your child is picked for a team and accepts the offer to play, as a parent you are deemed to have agreed to the following:

- I agree to my child travelling to and/or from school fixtures by **coach, mini-bus, staff lifts, parental lifts or for local fixtures, walking.** If you do not wish your child to travel by any one or more of these means, please contact the Head of PE. This may affect your child's selection for certain fixtures.
- If I were to assist with lifts, I can guarantee that my car will be insured and have an up to date M.O.T. Certificate.
- I give permission for my child to receive emergency medical treatment if required.
- During a school fixture I can be contacted on the recorded emergency number stated on my child's data collection sheet.
